Close to the Bottom

Tired of hearing nothing of 10 or 15 meters, or of having 20 meters close down at night? Most prognosticators agree that we are rapidly approaching the minimum of Sunspot Cycle 23, so hope is in sight. Although difficult to precisely predict, the bottom should be reached in late 2006 or early 2007. After that, propagation conditions on the HF bands should slowly but surely improve until the next maximum is achieved approximately 6 years from now. Cycle 24 is predicted to be quite similar to Cycle 23. ■
