Scholarships Available

The Foundation fro Amateur Radio, Inc., a non-profit organization with headquarters in Washington, D. C., plans to administer sixtysix scholarships for the academic year 1999-2000 to assist licensed radio amateurs. The Foundation, composed of over 75 local area



radio clubs, fully funds ten of these scholarships with the income from grants and its annual Hamfest. The remaining 56

are administered by the Foundation without cost to the various donors.

Licensed radio amateurs may compete for these awards if they plan to pursue a full-time course of studies beyond high school and are enrolled in or have been accepted for enrollment at an accredited university, college or technical school. The awards range from \$500 to \$2500 with preference given in some cases to residents of specified geographical areas or the pursuit of certain study programs. Florida, Maryland, New Jersey, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia and Wisconsin, are encouraged to apply for these opportunities.

FCC Adds Bite to Its Bark

The FCC Compliance and Information Bureau is finished listening for aggregious rule breakers and is now taking action. They have already shut down about 2 dozen pirate BC stations, 4 pirate HF stations and have sent violation notices to a New Jersey ham and two North Carolina hams for malicious interference with HF net operations and with VHF repeater operations. It looks like the years of lobbying for stronger enforcement on the amateur bands by the ARRL are having a beneficial effect.
