Fair Building at the County Fairgrounds. VE exams will also be held, starting at 9:00 am sharp in the Fair Administration Building.



#### Brief Summary of Field Day Rules

The times of operation are: 1800 UTC on Saturday, June 26th, through 2100 UTC on Sunday, June 27th. The entry category for the contest is the maximum number of simultaneous transmitters plus a letter designator as fol-



lows: A = club portable
(independent of commercial
mains); A-battery = club station using any source other than
commercial mains or motor-gen-

erator and at 5 watts or less; B = 1 or 2 person portable; B-battery = same as A-battery, but with 1 or 2 persons only; C = mobile; D =home stations operating from commercial mains (can contact only non-class D stations for points); E = home stations on emergency power. Usually, WCARC manages to scrape up enough equipment to operate in class 3A, but it all depends on who shows up.

The bands of operation are all amateur bands, excluding 30, 17 and 12 meters. When a contact is made, the following info is ex

### **Charges Dismissed**

You may recall the case of the young Kentucky amateur, Greg Godsey, KF4BDY, of Hopkinsville, who was charged with impersonating a public servant and disorderly conduct as a result of his participation at an emergency as an ARES member. In fact not only was he an ARES member, but was the Christian County EC!! He had been arrested and his HT confiscated with the additional specification that he was carrying a scanner capable of receiving police frequencies. The scanner charge was dropped after only a month, but the other charges have finally been dropped after a 2-year legal struggle. Godsey's family estimated a total expenditure of over \$3,000 in fighting the battle.
