

aster, with special assistance to the Red Cross.

These events clearly demonstrate that nobody is immune from this type event and that it can happen just about anywhere. It behooves us all as hams who benefit from the privilege of using the spectrum to give something back to contribute to our National welfare. Time and time again the value of trained amateur emergency operators who are able to step in with their equipment and skills when a communications disaster strikes has been convincingly demonstrated.

What can you do to help? Join and participate in the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES). Learn the basics of how hams can assist with emergency communications by participating in the practice exercises that are held from time to time. In fact, there will be a nationwide Simulated Emergency Test (SET) on the weekend of October 6-7. Monitor the K8TIH repeater for the start of the SET.

ARRL President Praises Amateur Radio Emergency Effort

NEWINGTON, CT, Sep 27, 2001--ARRL President Jim Haynie, W5JBP, took advantage of a visit to New York City hams to express his gratitude for the overall Amateur Radio volunteer effort in the wake of the terrorist attacks September 11.

"On behalf of the 680,000 ham operators in the US, thank you for doing such a fine job," he said during a visit September 21 with Amateur Radio Emergency Service volunteers at the heart of the communication effort. ARRL Hudson Division

Director Frank Fallon, N2FF, accompanied Haynie on his visit. "From the very first day I have been proud of the way ARRL members in the Hudson Division responded in overwhelming numbers," Fallon said. "So many responded that many, unfortunately, were turned away."

"It really has been our finest hour!" Fallon continued. "It has made us all very proud to be Amateur Radio operators." John MacInnes, a Red Cross communications officer based in Tucson, Arizona, expressed high praise for the Amateur Radio community and for ARRL. "We wouldn't be where we are today without the ham radio operators," he told Haynie. He said Haynie should be very proud of ARRL and asked him to relay his message of thanks throughout the amateur community.


later when it hit 282.6. The previous high solar flux for this cycle was 273.5 on March 28, 2001, and before that was 262 on May 17, 2000.

The high activity at the end of March and during this week would seem to shift the peak of the solar cycle forward, but that reading is always based on a smoothed running average, and is determined long after the peak. The determination of the peak is influenced by high daily values on many days around the period of peak activity, not just on one day of high numbers. But the high activity this week is not isolated. The trends have been solidly higher for two months. This would be a good time to check out DX on 10 meters.
