Repeater Woes

The K8TIH repeaters are not in operation at this writing. Due to the appearance of some strange audio symptoms, the Technical Committee investigated and found several problems. One involved the CAT-1000 controller and the other a PA at the transmitter site. Apparently the amp had gone down and the transmitter had been operating on battery power for quite some time. Thanks to the fine repair job performed by Jim-K8JU, the electronics problems have been taken care of. However in the process of effecting the repairs the digital audio memory was dropped and it was noticed that the machine was not properly identifying. We expect this problem to be remedied soon and the K8TIH repeaters should be back on the air soon.

NOAA Frequency to Change

The National Weather Service in Cleveland is replacing Toledo's NOAA Weather Radio All Hazards transmitter with an upgraded solid-state transmitter on Monday, March 3. The existing frequency will change from 162.550 MHZ to 162.500 MHZ to provide clearer transmission of all announcements. The power will be increased from 100 to 300 watts increasing the coverage area in Northwest Ohio by 15%. If a threat of severe weather exists, the implementation will be rescheduled for Tuesday, March 4.

The frequency of 162.500 MHZ assigned to Toledo is one of the newer NOAA Weather Radio All Hazards frequencies. Some older receivers that only tune to the original three NOAA radio frequencies of 162.4, 162.475 and 162.550, may not be able to receive the broadcast. Older receivers should be checked to ensure the capability to tune to the new frequency and be upgraded to a newer model, if necessary.
