You don't need to be an electronics genius to get your ham radio license in one day, but you will increase your chances of passing the test if you read through our study guide beforehand. Printed versions of the study guide can be purchased for \$13 at www.booklocker.com/books/3408.html.

There is a license examination fee of \$15, payable when you take the test. Two forms of photo ID are also required to take the test.
