As of now, there will be no change in our occupancy of the receiver site in the Offenhauer West

penthouse. This leaves the Club with the necessity of at least relocating the repeater transmitter to a new site.

At the same time, Craig, N8DJB, has come into possession of an abandoned cellular phone tower that he is graciously offering for the Club to use at nominal cost. There are many benefits associated with the N8DJB site, including a heated radio shack, electric service, and hard line strung up the tower.

The Technical Committee has inspected the proposed site in order to assess the projected costs that would be incurred if we chose to move the repeater there. Some of the major one-time expenses include: hiring a steeplejack to install the antennas, the purchase of 220 MHz control link equipment and, if the receiver is to be moved to the same site from Offenhauer, two sets of duplexers. The control link equipment has already been purchased, along with a new Station Master VHF antenna, at a cost of \$350. The estimated cost of two duplexer sets (one for 144 MHz and the other for 440 MHz) is nearly \$1200. The other expenses will of course be the continuing costs of utilities and rent. As yet, the Committee cannot make a reliable estimate of what these continuing costs will be.

A concern was raised at the December business meeting about the Club's limited annual income (about \$350 per year) and the feasibility of the proposed move since we don't know what the month-to-month demands on the Treasury will be. It is assumed that the one-time costs of \$750 to \$2,000 can be covered by mounting a pledged contribution drive.

The Club Officers and Trustees need to know your opinion on this issue. We are pledged to follow the expressed will of the membership as to which direction to take. Here are the options that we have come up with (some less frivolous than others):

1a. Proceed with the move of only the transmitter to N8DJB's tower assuming that the monthly continuing costs will be less than

\$20.00 per month. The fixed initial costs in this case will be the cost of the antennas and the steeplejack (total est. \$750).

- 1b. Same as 1a above, except move the transmitter <u>and</u> receiver to the new site. Fixed initial costs estimated at \$2,000 (duplexers added).
 - Seek another site for the transmitter. Suggestions include: Court House tower, a BG water tower, or Offenhauer West/East. In any of these cases, the same minimum initial fixed costs will be incurred (except for Offenhauer West where the duplexers must be added). In any of the foregoing sites, permission will of course have to be obtained and this possibility has not yet been explored. One benefit of staying with BGSU is that there have been no utilities or rental charges to date---this is a benefit when compared with the other sites.
 - 3. Discontinue the Club's repeater service.

Please carefully consider these options, or even suggest another option if you wish to. We need to know your opinion!

He reiterated the need for the Club to be careful about such continuing expenses to make sure they do not exceed the income from dues. Motion passed with minimum discussion. 2013 Officer Slate: After some repartee, all of the current officers except for the President indicated that they will continue in office for next year. Hearing no immediate response, he said that he and the other officers would confer on this issue in order to have a complete slate by the time of the banquet.

Use LoTW to Confirm QSOs

Logbook of The World - LoTW - is an exciting way for Radio Amateurs to confirm two-way contacts they have made and use the confirmations as credit toward various awards.

Because Logbook of The World uses double blind comparison, users cannot see what other users have uploaded unless there is a matched QSO. All files uploaded to LoTW are electronically signed by verified users. Logbook of The World maintains the integrity of the QSO verification process that has long been the hallmark of ARRL awards.

Logbook of The World is a very powerful system capable of collecting and matching QSO data from users all over the world. When properly configured, LoTW can accommodate a variety of operating situations, such as DXpeditions, previously held call signs and QSL managers.

By using digitally signed certificates with QSO date ranges and station locations for geographic information, Logbook of The World is able to accommodate clubs, QSL managers, Dxpeditions, mobile and rover operators just as easily as it handles the individual user with one call sign and one location.

If you are a DX hound or are pursuing the Worked All States award, LoTW certainly beats using

the old paper QSL method. Your editor has participated in the LoTW program for several years now, and has uploaded well over 10,000 QSOs to the system with approximately 2,400 contacts confirmed electronically.

The system works very smoothly---after registering and receiving your encoded certificate, you can then log on and upload your QSOs in encoded ADIF (Amateur Data Interchange Format) to the LoTW server. All of the software necessary to encode the certificate and the log files is furnished on site. The LoTW system gives you confirmation that the file has been received, and after a few hours or

days, depending on how busy the system is, you will see confirmed QSOs in your account. The neat thing is that the necessary qualifications for various awards are automatically registered. The awards covered include: Worked All States (WAS), DX Century Club (DXCC), VHF/UHF Century Club (VUCC), and Worked All Prefixes (WPX). the various endorsement categories are totted up automatically as your QSOs are confirmed. When you finally become qualified for an award, the application process can also be done on-line, usually with the payment of some green stamps.
